Transportation IIJA Funding

IIJA provides advance funding for an array of transportation programs for FY 2022-FY 2026. These advance appropriations are in addition to regular funding provided by the annual appropriations bills and should be added to the numbers in the chart below.

• For example, IIJA provides \$1.5 billion per year for RAISE and the FY 2024 Transportation Appropriations Act provides \$345 million, for an FY 2024 total of \$1.845 billion
